Title 9, California Code of Regulations****LICENSURE AND CERTIFICATION FEES****Supplemental Notice of Intention to Provide Public Notices by Electronic Means**

Health and Safety Code (HSC) Section 11833.02 requires the Department of Alcohol and Drug Programs (ADP) to charge licensure and certification fees for all providers of residential or outpatient alcoholism or drug abuse recovery or treatment services, regardless of the form of organization or ownership. In October 2007, ADP implemented HSC Section 11833.02 through ADP Bulletin 07-11. On June 29, 2009, ADP adopted emergency regulations codifying the fees, policies, and requirements that have remained in effect since ADP Bulletin 07-11 was originally issued in 2007. ADP is now in the process of making those emergency regulations permanent.
